

Sociology of deviant behaviour.

The discipline is aimed at developing students' ability to analyse social deviations – a phenomenon that is closely related to the state of anomie in society, to reveal the content of the main forms of deviant behaviour in modern society, to identify ways to resist social deviations.

The main tasks of studying the credit module "Sociology of deviant behaviour" are:

- to form an idea of the basic sociological theories that explain deviant behaviour in society;

- to form an idea of the relationship and interaction of objective and subjective factors of deviant behaviour;

- to identify the specifics of sociological analysis of aggression as a social phenomenon, the main differences between different types of aggression;

- to master the key concepts that make up the framework of theories of deviant behaviour: social control, social norm, social sanction, conformism, conformity, deviation, deviant subculture, deviant socialization, gray deviations, light deviations, dark deviations, positive and negative deviations, etc.;

- to reveal the content and main directions of modern preventive technologies to negative deviant phenomena.
